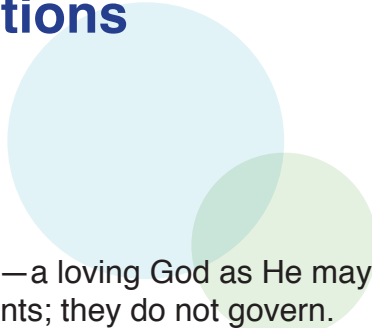


Guiding Principles: Putting Our New Traditions Workbook to Work

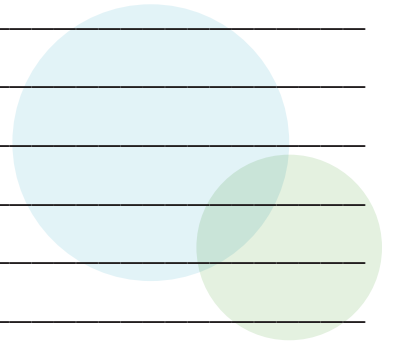


Small Group Discussion Questions

Tradition Two: For our group purpose there is but one ultimate authority—a loving God as He may express Himself in our group conscience. Our leaders are but trusted servants; they do not govern.

*Groups focus on our primary purpose: to carry the message to the addict who still suffers.
Service beyond the group carries out some secondary purposes: creating meeting lists, getting literature into facilities, or putting on a dance. Each of these, in turn, supports our primary purpose. NA service is always connected in some way to our group purpose, and is under the same direction: Our leaders do not govern, service is not authority, and the ability to serve depends on the trust of those around us.*

Discuss: What does a good group conscience process look like? What would an observer notice about decision making in our service body?
